## Village Design Statement

The Parish Council was asked by Cotswold District Council to prepare a Village Design Statement and you may have observed someone photographing village houses in preparation. The result is available for viewing at the Post Office and an exhibition in the Village Hall is being planned for which invitations will be sent to all households. There will also be a questionnaire to enable input

from all residents of the Parish.

The object of the statement is to:

- ◆ Be an historic and visual record of the village.
- Point out features and local landmarks that should be preserved.
- State what we think are particular characteristics of buildings in our village and offer preferred solutions for owners considering alterations.
- ◆ Point out practical and visual needs in the village including new tree planting.

Gloucestershire Community Health Council is consulting us about two current proposals:


- In-patient E.N.T. (Ear Nose and Throat) services will be at Gloucester Royal only.
