Forthefirsttimein12yearsapollwasheld toelectthenewParishCouncil. Therewere eightnominationsforthesevenplace s.

Several candidates and a spouse or two went to the countatMoretonFireCollege.

Sevenhampton was the last of three coun tsat "Table 4" and so it got later and later before the system - a Byzantine version of Blue Peter - threw up the results. As the ball ot papers were lined up across the counting sheets, it was obvious that everyone had a respectable number of crosses by their name. No candidate was supported by less than half of those voting.



Those elected were Leslie Agius; Charles Arkell; John Davis; Kit Gregory; Anne Jackson; Thomas Jackson and Bill Jenkin. Maurice Cann, was behind by only one vote and prompted a school of thought that believes he was the big winner. Showed willing but doesn't have to go to the meetings. Seems a good result.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The **AnnualParish Meeting** on April 21 st thanked and said good - byeto some familiar faces who have stood down from office often afterlong service. It also heralded the arrival of some new ones.

Thoseleaving office -Arthur Challoner, District Councillor for many years; John Lanfear parish councillor for 24 years and Chairman for 18; Colin Rosser, Chairman of the Par ish Council; Lesley Ballwho was Parish Clerk for 12 years and Cherrie Handy, parish councillor. Thankswere expressed to all the councillors and voluntary members of committees.

Inhisreport, ColinRosser(Chairman)lookedbackat the Village Appraisal recommendations of 1996. There had been some successes: The relocation of the Post Office to the Village Hall; publication of his magazine; the "Good Neighbour" Scheme; Leisure activities for the under 16 swere all examples. The rehad also been failures: The acquisition of sites for a carpark and recreation field had both proved impossible.

Colinreminded themeeting that minutes of all Council proceedings are lodged in the Post Office. A local information leaflet is also available from the Post Office (it is constantly up -dated).

Otheritems mentioned werethedisruption caused by the water and electricity works; grass verge maintenance; the use ful work of the Parish Tree Warden (John Jackson); the loan from the County Council for a year



villagehall withinternet connection, for use by any Parishioner who caresto book. Some questions were raised about security and funding for this.

Areportaboutthe Village Design Statement caused much comment from the floor and an open meeting was arranged to discuss this further. (Report next column)

Alsoraised by the meeting: Speed restrictions through the village (the County Surveyor is talking to the Police about signs and possible speed limits through the Parish); Suggestions were made for improving communication between the Parish Council and the public.

Therewas alot of debate about what was considered acceptable and the powers of individuals or authorities to dictate "good taste". It was stressed tha the statement would give the residents of the villages as ay into what would otherwise be left to "the powers that be".

Theme eting agreed that the committee appointed by The Parish Council should proceed with the document.

Itisimportanttoinvolveth eresidentsof Sevenhampton and Brockhampton on as wideabasis as possible and itishoped that all residents will complete aquestion naire which will be sent to all households in the autumn. Later in the year an exhibition will beheld in the village hall with photographs of all our buildings in the village followed by an open discussion.

New Years Eve 2000?


Shall we celebrate again - to round off the year (and satisfy those who say that's when it should be)? - watch this space.
