# Parish Precept to Rise

The Parish Council has decided to raise the annual parish precept from £5,000 to £6,500 for the year 2016/17. This is the first rise for ten years. It has become necessary as more demands are made on parish and town councils' resources because of cuts in the funding to District and County Councils. For example the parish was asked last year to contribute to the cost of painting double white lines on part of the A436 for improved safety. The work of the parish clerk has also increased because of changes in local government legislation. The 'transparency code' requires many documents be posted online. The council needs to upgrade its website to conform to a more accessible and professional style.

In order for the council to continue to support the local community like in its support for the Rhodes Memorial Hall when it is required, it believes it needs this increase.

#### **Grit Monitors**

Once again, the Parish Council needs individuals prepared to keep an eye on the amount of grit in local grit bins. Glos Highways only replenish them once a year and when that supply has run out there are locally stored salt bags which can be emptied into the bins as required. Grit monitors would alert the Parish Council when bins need topping up. If you think you could do that where you live please contact the parish clerk (see below\*).

# For some time the usefulness of having a Public Access Defibrillator in the villages has been debated but now we have one so the message is learn its potential and how it fits into life-saving efforts.

### Lynne & Robert Jackson (820408) laid on a training session at the Village Hall last Saturday and would like local groups to introduce it to their members.

For training purposes the kit includes Mini-Resusci-Annies and copies of the BHF DVD showing squeaky clean professionals telling us what to do - repeatedly. Annoying but worth it for the basics of what to check on the casualty, how to do CPR as well as the use of the defib.

#### The device will be on the outside wall to the right of the Hall noticeboard and is released by keying in a code. It can then be taken to the emergency.

The emphasis is to call 999, grab any available help, begin CPR. Emergency services know the defibs locations and the access code.

Call: 999. Your mobile connects to all networks.

**P**ush: Chest compressions & mouth to mouth should continue if casualty still not breathing.



**R**escue: Continue till paramedics arrive.

We learned that anything tried to save someone not breathing is worthwhile. If your efforts are imperfect they still help. Not trying anything usually has only one end result.
