Time to read Lynne's Chairman's report on the Parish Council. Good to know what they're up to.



## **Parish Council Meeting**

The next meeting of Sevenhampton Parish Council will take place on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> May at 7.30pm in The Reading Room, Rhodes Memorial Hall, Brockhampton, GL54 5XH.

This will be the annual parish council meeting where the chairman and other officers are elected.

The public is welcome to attend and there will be a question and answer session at the start of the meeting if required.

### Affordable Housing & 'Village Space' Still Parish Council's Long Term Aim

Parish Chairman Lynne Jackson once again reiterated that the long term ambition of the council was for there to be some form of affordable housing and a 'village space' within the Parish. Unfortunately in recent years these wishes have been hampered by the non availability of any suitable land.

In her annual report to the parish she also outlined the various bits of on going business which in 2016/17 have included:

- The relaunch of the village website.
- Renewal of some stiles undertaken by the Cotswold Wardens and clearing the path through the Churchyard undertaken by the 'payback volunteers'. Making donations to both these groups of volunteers.
- Making donations to the Rhodes Memorial Hall and Good Neighbourhood Scheme.
- Setting up a register for notification of events particularly fireworks.
- Installing of a dog poo bin.
- Pressing for the retention of the Brockhampton telephone kiosk.
- To mark the Queen's 90th Birthday the giving of commemorative medals to people in the parish in their 90th year or over.
- Planting of 150 native trees around the parish courtesy of the Tree Council.
- Opposing the merger of Cotswold District Council with West Oxon Council.
- Monitoring planning applications within the parish and commenting on some of them.
- Raising the parish precept to £7,000 (which until 2016/17 had not increased for ten years) to take into account public funding cuts and devolvement of some costs to local level. Also anticipating a requirement for additional training in the coming year.
- Continuing our efforts to lobby highways with regards to potholes and speed reduction locally.

The chairman ended the report by thanking the council and the Parish Clerk for their efforts and pledged that council will endeavour to meet the needs of the parishioners to provide a safe, social and attractive community.

The idea has been floated that the village should take part in 'The Great Get Together'. The plan is that local community events will take



place on 17<sup>th</sup>/18<sup>th</sup> June not only to honour the life of Jo Cox, the MP who tragically lost her life last year, but also to celebrate the fact that "we have far more in common than that which divides us" - as Jo put it in her maiden speech in Parliament.

The Big Lunch (the organisers behind the The Big Jubilee Lunch street parties) are planning the event nationally and dozens of other organisations are getting involved from Help for Heroes to Amnesty International; the RNLI to the RSPB; the Scouts the Guides, The Women's Institute and the Premier League.

If we had an event here in Seven/ Brockhampton it could be big or small, indoors or out – it would be entirely up to us. It could be a street party, a barbecue, a picnic or a bake off but it would be part of a big national occasion.

No decision has been made as to whether this will go ahead here or not but if you have any thoughts please talk to Lynne Jackson who will coordinate the bright (and any not-so bright) ideas.
