Would you Like to be a Parish Councillor?

A vacancy has occurred on Sevenhampton Parish Council due to the resignation of Cllr Tex Cook. A formal notice of the vacancy will appear on notice boards and on the www.sevenhampton.org website in the very near future. If ten electors or more ask the returning officer at Cotswold District Council for an election within 14 days of the notice appearing then an election will be held, failing that the Parish Council may co-opt a councillor

In advance of that, if you would like to serve this community by becoming a councillor please let the parish clerk know (see below for contact details) - training is available.

Grit Bins

The green grit bins (provided by the Parish Council) and blue bins (provided by Glos Highways) are refilled annually for Gloucestershire Highways by Amey PLC. Some piles of salt/grit mixtures are left on the roadside in addition to the bins. Unfortunately this happens in the summer months when the road crews are least busy. The piles of grit consequently tend to leach salt out into the surrounding area and they get covered by undergrowth making them both unusable for their intended purpose and a threat to the environment. As a result the parish council is hoping before the winter of 2018/19 to obtain funding for some more grit bins, some of which may be outside the parish but on roads which many of residents in the parish use, e.g. on the road to Syreford. It may be useful if you could let the Parish Clerk know of any areas which would benefit from another grit bin, or if it is essential and there is no alternative, the location of a necessary pile of grit. Unfortunately none of this will take place before the winter which is now upon us however the parish has available some bags of grit/salt for topping up depleted public bins etc. Please let the Parish Clerk know if these are required.


Film Shows - would anyone like to take over?

What it entails

- Collecting kit and DVD from the previous village on the circuit (this is sometimes delivered to us).
- Arranging with the next village on the circuit a date and time for them to pick up the kit.
- Organising some publicity for the film.
- On the day, setting up the kit and arranging the hall for the show, showing the film and packing it all away afterwards.
- Arranging for admission fees to be collected and for takings to be paid into hall funds.
- Informing the hall treasurer of the totals paid in and the expected amount to be invoiced by SLM.
