Good Neighbourhood Scheme



For those new to the parish here is a little background on the Scheme.

It was started in 1998 when the Village Appraisal identified a transport need for those unable to drive or use the limited bus service. The Appraisal also revealed that there were volunteers willing to offer their services as drivers.

It is not intended that it should be regarded as a taxi service or to replace the very limited bus service. The aim is to provide transport to doctor or hospital appointments, shopping, or collect prescriptions or provisions etc. Residents contact one of the co-ordinators who will then arrange a driver from the list of volunteers. The users pay a charge to the driver to cover their costs which is fixed for regular destinations. Other journeys are charged at approximately 45p per mile with a minimum charge of £3.50. Last year 90 journeys were undertaken which were much appreciated by the users.

Drivers wanted

Although there are normally enough drivers to cover requests there are times when two or more volunteers may be away at the same time (e.g. a couple who are both drivers). It then becomes more difficult to cover all needs. If you think you could help out please contact one of the organisers (see below).

If you need help yourself please contact a co-ordinator.



Surplus funds from the Show have traditionally been donated to suitable local projects and this year the Committee agreed to give £800 towards the maintenance of the Sevenhampton and Charlton Abbotts Churchyards, £400 for the provision of more Grit bins in the parish of Sevenhampton and £540 for electrical improvements to the Brockhampton Village Hall.
