Changes to Waste & Recycling Collections

Cotswold District Council has approved changes to the Waste and Recycling collections.

New state-of-the art collection vehicles will come into service during the latter half of 2019.

The new fleet will enable the Council to collect a much wider range of items; this means that residents will be able to recycle used textiles, household batteries, electrical and electronic equipment, and Tetrapak cartons at the kerbside for the first time

Additional service changes will be introduced, with the most noticeable being:

- the separation of the weekly food waste collections from garden waste to produce better quality recycled products in line with county-wide practices;
- provision of bigger and more robust household food caddies and cardboard recycling sacks;
- a switch to fortnightly garden waste collections with a three month suspension of the service during winter months. It has also been proposed to reduce the cost of garden waste licences.
