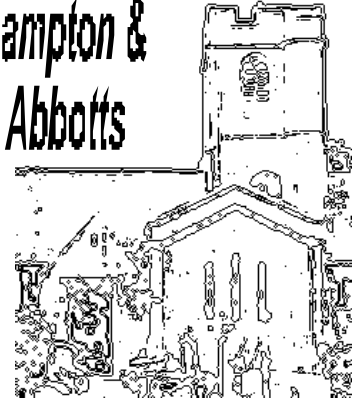

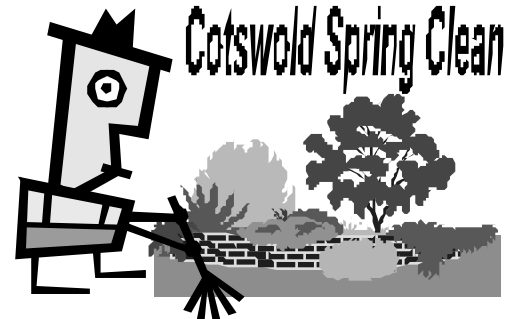
Kerbside recycling and refuse collection days; Spring 2000

An afternoon and evening at **Alderly Grange and Hunts Court Gardens** followed by a supper in a pub by the **River Severn** is the programme for this year's coach trip organised by the Produce Show Committee.

Both gardens are near Wotton-under-Edge. **Alderly Grange** has a Walled Garden with fine trees, roses, herb gardens and aromatic plants; **Hunts Court** unusual shrubs, 450 varieties old roses, a large collection of penstemons in peaceful 2½ acre garden with lawns set against tree clad hills and Tyndale monument. Superb views. House (not open) possible birthplace of the martyr William Tyndale

The cost will be about £6.50 each for the coach and entrance fees. Full details of times etc. will be given nearer the date.
