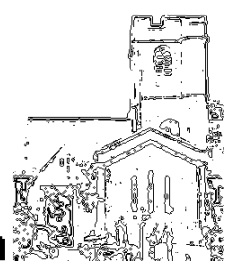

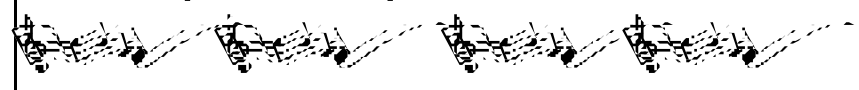


Celebration Service at St Andrews

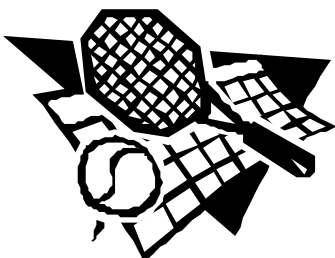

TAX BONUS FOR YOUR FAVOURITE CAUSES

A timely reminder from Gill Hyatt about the changes enabling charities to more easily claim back tax you have paid on your donation to charity.

The church seems admirably well-organised on the subject but it is important to note Gill's reminder that whichever charity you support can benefit. You can ring the Inland Revenue on 01242 585585 and ask for their advice. (It might also be possible to tap into the expertise of those organising for the church funds - they're a friendly enough bunch.)

Somehow, it seems a bit un-British to blow your own trumpet by saying, 'I'm giving such and such to Charity X' - with presumably details of your National Insurance number, etc. - but if your favourite good cause gets a bonus on your giving, it's well worth it.

There'll be no refund based on your lottery ticket - that'll remain gambling with charitable overtones. Sorry!

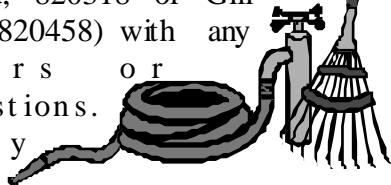
NEW TAX RULES CHARITABLE GIVING

There is now an improved system for giving to allow all charities to recover the tax that the donor has already paid. This can be used to benefit the Church and applies to both regular and "one off" contributions, as long as they are identifiable. 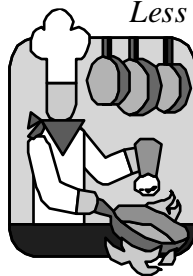

YOUR VILLAGE HALL

Everyone is aware that the Rhodes Hall caters for most local interests as venue for Brockhampton Amateur Dramatic Society, Century Club, Child Health Services and Toddlers Group, Keep Fit Classes, Luncheon Club, Parish Council, P.C.C., Produce Show, Brockhampton Quilters, Women's Institute and Young Leisure Club. Then there are Jumble Sales, Exhibitions, Lectures, Fashion Shows, etc.

A Local Resource for All



Less well known is that it can be hired for private occasions giving more space for entertaining than most of us have at home.

The Hall and Reading Room can be hired together for larger functions where 70 people can easily be

accommodated for £7.00 per hour.

This includes all facilities including a well-equipped kitchen with its ample china, cutlery, glassware to meet your needs.

Smaller groups? The main Hall or Reading Room can be hired separately.

Entertaining at home? Why not borrow the crocks?

There is a very reasonable hire service for china, cutlery, glasses and other kitchen equipment. Plates and drinking glasses are 5p per item per day.
