TheftsofGardentoolsandequipment

Anongoing problem in North Cotswolds area is the theft of garden tools and equipment from sheds and outbuildings. Recently a number of ride -on mower s have been stolen (one unfortunately from Brockhampton). This is the advice from the police:

"Sheddoors are notoriously easy toget into, so strengthen the door and the frame ifyoucan. Usestrong padb ars and closes hacklepadlocks. 5 -levermortise locks are the best for normal solid doors.

Are the windows secure? Use perspex or polycarbonate sheet instead of glass. Fita windowlock on opening windows and astrong grille or heavy wire mesh. Usenet curtains to detercasual viewing. Consider fitt inganalarm. Does your insurance cover the shedor garage and all the tools stored there? Is everything post -coded, so that you could identify it if it was stolen? Most items can be marked by a variety of methods (etching, UV pen, paint stencilling etc) and easily identifiable items will be more difficult for the thie fto dispose of and, there fore, less likely to be taken i n the first place. Keep a note of serial numbers

Doyous ecure property within the shed? Then, even if some one did break intothey would not just beable to walk off with all your valuable items. Consider this forcycles, mowers, powertools and, o fcourse, ladders,"

You can obtain a reasonably cheap battery powered a larm for sheds and postcoding kits from the mobile polic estation (see below).

Two men were arrested in connection with the thefts of staddle stones through the alertness of Neighbour hood Watch members at Hazleton. Garden ornaments are unfortunately atarget forthieves.

There was no water or electricity laid on until the en d of the Second World War. They bought sweets at a local shop and stamps at the Old Post Office which was run by two old ladies and was very dark inside. There were five shops in the villages at one time. They watched the localblacksmithatworkinthe OldForge. Allthese facilities, sadly, are now gone.

Henry IV awarded the estate to his 'Yeomano



in 1415 for service at Agincourt. It was in the Conings by family for 300 years then in 1810 it was bought by the Arkwrights, the cotton mill industrialists. They built the 19 century castle. The penniless Jack Arkwright sold the estate in 1911 and it gradually fell into decay.

In 1994 american millionaire Robert van Kampen boughtth eestate. He soldthe farms
to the farmers and appointed a caretaker, Richard Waghorn, who before long was
managing therestor ation of the castleat a cost of about £6m. In 1996 Waghorn thought
how splendid it would be to make something of the extensive grounds. He had Simon
Dorrell, art editor of 'Hortus' draw up plans on a grand scale with avenues, canals, a
maze, a tunnel an da sunken garden, together with pavilions and belvederes. Van
Kampen fell in love with the plans and quite simply said 'yes' a tacost of about another
£6m.

With a namelike Hampton Court there has to be a maze (of over 1,000 yew trees, laid out in 1997) in the centre you enter a tower from which leads a 'secret' tunnel. You emerge through a thatch edpavilion to as unkengarden where a water fall cascades down the stony sides into a pond.

Therear ewalled gardens, wat ergarden, herbaceous borders (with a purple and yellow theme) and a Dutch garden. Although some original features have been retained much has been b uilt from scratch using the permanent staff of craftsmen. Much work is still in progress - the gardens opened to the public in 2000. Outside the eight acregarden there is a haha, parkland and agricultural land making up 100 acres in all.




