Whilst it's always good to see visiting grandkids it would be nice to have new recruits to the mothers & toddlers. Important too to see an end to rural people driven towards.

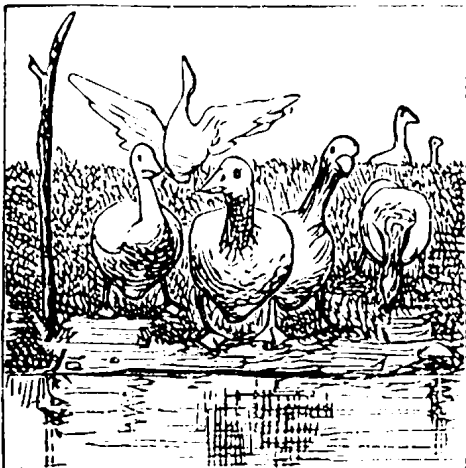
A few more things, spend lots of money at next week's jumble sale. It's a splendid cause - not sentimental over animals but supporting our interdependence.

Perfect Setting for Musical Feasts

From our Music Correspondent

Sevenhampton parishioners and friends have been treated to a feast of wonderful music this summer at St. Andrew's Church.

In August the newly formed Aubrey String Trio, led by Buffy North (nee Rowe), performed pieces by Schubert, Beethoven and Dohnanyi. Their other recitals include Chichester, Portsmouth and Southwark Cathedrals and the National Portrait Gallery.

Then, on September 21st, a Gala Concert to celebrate work on the restored organ took place. The organist was leading recitalist and organ builder, Paul Derrett, who had also carried out the restoration work on the organ. He was joined by Celia Milner, of the BBC Symphony Orchestra, leading the multi-talented eight-strong Waterhouse Orchestra of her family and friends. The evening began with a Pastoral by J.S. Bach, followed by a piece by Samuel Wesley.

The orchestra played Mozart's lively Divertimento for Strings and then combined with the organ for Mozart's Epistle Sonata. The organist started the second half with a Fugue by Reincken, then a more contemporary item by Herbert Howells and the evening ended with the sumptuous Concerto for Organ and Strings in B flat by Handel. This began with precision and sensitivity and developed as spiritual quality enhanced by the peace and beauty of the setting within St Andrew's ancient walls.

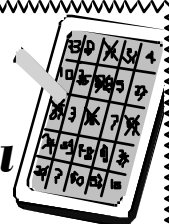
