The 'institute' has diversified into various clubs & societies which use the Village Hall but one of those - The Toddlers Group which met twice a month has had to suspend meeting b cause of falling numbers* Isthis asym tom of the lack of any suitable housing in the village for young local families? The report of the recent affordablehousing survey is briefly summarised overleaf.

The Church remains and the church yard is expanding. The **Hyattcentenary extension is** being consecrated by the Bishopof Tewkesbury on 29th June (see over).

Changewill becoming as the one remaing pub - the Craven Arms - must be sold. Among the potential buyers, a 'Village Pub' company is being formed to preserve the puband to avoid the prospect of property speculation on the site.

The formation of a 'Village Pub' company will try to ensure that the Craven Arms does not fall into the hands of parties not interested in e taining it as a pub. There is now an opportunity of purchasing it at a competitive price in order to preserve it. Locals, regulars and friends etc will be able to invest in shares and/or a 5 year loan (minimum £3,000). At enant would be installed and it would be his/her business. The 'pub company' would have no say in the running other than ce tain criteria in the lease. No "Mefirst, don' tyouk now Iown the place!" allowed.

Affordable Housing

Some Need, But Where Do We Go From Here?

Thereportoftherecentsurveyonlocalhousingneedshas beenpu blished.

It suggests that there is a definite if small demand for some affordable housing in the parish, in fact 4% of all forms sent out indicated a need for alternative housing. Some of these would be ruled out because either they could afford to buy on theopenmarket, others gave in sufficient financial information to judge.

Oftheremaining five, three needed to move because t heircurrent accommodation was insufficient for their needs.

Two replies indicated that their children wanted to set up home in theparish.

Two returns revealed that previous household members would return to the village if affordablehousing was availab le.

What now?

Thereport is not very clear on where we take it from here, it asks us (the parish) to co ntactall those who identified themselves and indicated a need asking them to go on the local authority housing list (if appropri ate). Unfortunately wedo not know who those households are because the forms were quiterightly confidential! However, I fyou think you were one of those households please contact the rural housing enabler, Lesley Archerat Gloucestershire Rural Communi ty Council, 01452528491 toprovide further information.
