#### **Affordable Housing Still on the Agenda**

The Parish Council still believes that the provision of affordable housing for local people who cannot afford to buy in the current market is essential if the village is to remain vibrant and alive. Usual planning restrictions are often waived for this type of development (e.g. agricultural land may be developed). Prices paid for such plots are higher than for agricultural land although not as high as normal development land. Any plot found would need to be generally acceptable to the village. If you have a plot which you think may be suitable please get in touch with Martin Podd (820051) or the Parish Clerk (820718).

The need for affordable housing in the village was identified in the survey undertaken in 2003.
