Choice of films for Jan 5th overleaf so if you have strong view e-mail us.



## SEVENHAMPTON PARISH COUNCIL a New Direction?

#### from the Parish Chairman, Lesley Ball:

Next May elections will be held and you will be asked to vote for who you want to see on the Parish Council. There will be changes as several current councillors having served for a long time will not be standing for re-election.

This therefore provides a good opportunity for those interested in being more involved in the Parish to offer themselves as prospective Councillors. Being elected as a councillor will not provide you with the 'Wisdom of Solomon' (although some of your parishioners may expect it!) but the role is both interesting and challenging if occasionally maddening. Parish Councils play an important role in promoting the interests of parishes and form the base of the pyramid of elected bodies who govern our country.

#### Could you be a Parish Councillor?

The role of Parish Councillor is to raise local issues with the Council and to make decisions on behalf of the Parish. It is important that new Parish Councillors accept the appropriate training and accept that the job is to represent the interests of the whole Parish. To listen to differing views on issues (even ones you don't agree with) and then to decide in Council what would best benefit the Parish. The Council works to a Code of Conduct to guide it in maintaining proper standards but the main duties are to attend meetings, abide by majority decisions, maintain a proper standard of behaviour and so not bring the Council into disrepute.

#### Interested?

If you think you would like to become a Parish Councillor, the first step is to come to our meetings to see how business is conducted. There are two more meetings\* before the elections so take the opportunity to come along and find out what goes on in your community and decide what you could contribute.

## Disappointing Response to Flawed Housing Survey

Out of 157 affordable housing questionnaires sent out there were only 24 responses. 14 were against any proposal and 10 in favour. Three households were interested (only 2 were considered to be in need of affordable housing.) However 109 people on the housing register wish to move to the Parish although how many have a local connection is not known.

The parish clerk will now be in touch with Cotswold District Council about the viability of the project in view of the response and also the position regarding funding.

One view expressed at the parish council was that, because of poor design, it was not obvious that the question "do you think there is a need for affordable housing within the parish" was intended for all recipients. The impression given was that only if personally in need of affordable housing should one return the form

## **Christmas Refuse & Recycling Collections**

**Cotswold District Council** 

**Monday 25th December (lwr Sevenh.):** for this week there will be *no collection* of **refuse**.

#### Wednesday 27th December

Collection of refuse and recycling will go ahead as *normal*, *i.e not one day late*.

#### **Monday 1st January**

collection of refuse and recycling will be on Tuesday 2nd January (*one day late*).

Wednesday 3rd January collection of refuse will be on Thursday 4th January (one day late).



For both Christmas week and New Year the collections will be **one day late**, i.e. on Thurs 28th Dec. and Thurs 4th Jan.
