In a village with more grandparents than parents and with parents often opting for private education, it remains vital that those within the state system should have fair access to a good local education.

Balcarras's leaked though unannouncedplans to exclude pupils not living within amile of the school impacts on rural schools and families who have sent children there for generations. This seems plain wrong. If this is simply an unintended consequence of their Cheltenham catch mentpolicy, then it needs rectifying.



Joseph Kinane, head teacher of Andovers for dPrimary has notified parents of the intention of Balcarras School to exclude children from traditional rural feeders chools from continuing their education at Balcarras.

Balcarrashasen joyed increasing popularity and istrying to limit its intake. Excluded Chelten hamparents & pupils still have several choices in Chelten ham.
