Parish Council to Investigate Naming Streets

The parish council is to look into the possibility of giving our lanes formal names. Only Church Lane & Park Lane appear on maps which makes it difficult for the increasing number of courier van drivers. If formal names were given to the roads they would, in time, appear on maps and in satellite navigation data. The parish council wishes to make it clear that it does NOT want street name signs.

Initially the council will only investigate what the procedure is. Meanwhile let them know what you think. Is it is a good or bad idea? Also, if you think it appropriate, what name would you


