As announced by Buckingham Palace, The Big Jubilee Lunch will be a part of the main programme of events over the central weekend of Diamond Jubilee celebrations in June 2012. For our villages a "Big LATE Lunch" is being planned under canvas in the Show Field at about 5pm. A band has already been booked and the food will be provided. It will

be free for children under 7 but there will be a charge for adults, how much will depend on the numbers attending and the type of food supplied but it will be as low as possible (the event is partly being subsidised by the Parish Council).

The organisers need to know now how many people will want to attend in order to plan suitable catering and calculate costs etc . So although it may seem a long way ahead it would be very useful to tell them now. 
