At the AGM of the Produce Show on 8th November the Committee noted the following highlights from the 2011 Show. Overall entries are down on the recent record set in 2010; a good turn out on the day considering the weather and an overall surplus of £1,761. The Committee set aside £500 of the show's total funds to purchase a new marquee and committed £700 to support the Queen's Diamond Jubilee celebrations in the parishes and £800 to help fund repairs to the stonework of the Rhodes Memorial Hall.
