Rhodes Village Hall - Charges to Rise

The charges for the hire of the hall will increase with effect from 1 April. For the clubs and societies that are regular users the hire charge for the main room will rise to £5 per hour and for the reading room to £3.50 per hour.

For other users the charges will be £10 and £6 per hour. Those few non regular users who already have a booking will not bear the new charges.

Malcolm Bell - Chairman of the hall management committee – comments "Whilst nobody likes paying more for anything the charges have not been revised since 2008 and in that time the hall has not been immune to cost increases, most significantly increases in heating and lighting costs. These new charges are in line with those charged by other halls in our immediate vicinity and the amenity of the hall has been improved over this period with the provision of upgraded toilets and a new disabled toilet and the provision of a new sound system. In addition substantial work has been done to renew roofing and improve drainage round the hall. All of that has cost in excess of £20,000 and required improvements to the fire safety system and much needed major work on the external stonework of the hall are likely to absorb another £20,000 in the next twelve months. After that further work on internal timber affected by damp an upgrade to the electrical system and a complete internal redecorate are on the agenda. All of this will require continued careful planning and use of the hall's cash resources."

New North Cotswolds Hospital



From Lynne Jackson:-

Two of the parish council were invited to a pre-opening tour of the new North Cotswold hospital just south of Moreton. Sitting in landscaped grounds and with ample and level parking it opens on the 31 March. On the first floor are 22 en-suite rooms, day room and dining room. On the ground floor there is a minor injuries unit and x-ray dept. This will be nurse led with on call doctor at weekends and open 7 days a week 8am-8pm. There is a special physiotherapy suite and consultant led outpatient services for ophthalmology, gynaecology, orthopaedics, dermatology, audiology, ENT, mental health and children's services as well as room for visiting mobile screening services. The whole building and grounds have been designed with artists and reflect the colours of the Cotswolds with related artwork making for relaxing and pleasing surroundings.






