#### Village Hall Survey

The Rhodes Memorial Hall Management Committee will shortly be delivering a brief survey seeking your views on the use of the hall and how it can be improved to advance on the already extensive use that is made of it.

#### Vital Repairs

Chairman Malcolm Bell told us that having spent nearly £29,000 on vital repairs to the fabric of the hall and upgrading fire safety systems we now need to spend a further 12 to 15 thousand pounds on rectifying damp issues in the internal walls and floors of the hall. The hall does not have reserves remaining to do this and will be seeking grant funding for this.

#### Why we need a good response

As part of that we need to paint a picture of how the community views the hall as a community asset and therefore a good response to the survey is most important. In addition it will help the committee ensure it continues to provide the sort of activities and events in the hall which people want to see being put on and to participate in.

#### **Produce Show and Fete**

#### **Broadband**

Councils in Gloucestershire and Herefordshire have agreed to enter into final negotiations with a single supplier to deliver high-speed broadband to rural areas.

The councils will now continue to negotiate with the single bidder in the final stage of the procurement process. The proposed contract is for a wholesale broadband network across both counties.

#### **Kerbside Rigid Plastics Collection**

#### Starts on 11th October

You should by now have received a white plastic sack for recycling 'rigid' plastics. If you haven't received yours\* call the council on 01285 623123.

The new fortnightly service starts for us\* on *Thurs 11<sup>th</sup> October*. It will be on the same days as the other recycling collections (there will only be one vehicle for all recycling) but *please don't hoard plastic* until that date which could overload the scheme in the first week.



#### What plastics can be recycled?

The new service will be for all 'Rigid' plastics – bottles, tubs, trays, pots etc. The Council has deliberately avoided specifying different plastic types which would require householders to check the symbols on plastic products to decide whether a product is recyclable. Instead, they will collect all rigid plastics. However don't put films, food wrap and 'fly away' plastics in the sack.

#### Wash and squash

Whilst some plastics will bounce back once squashed, where possible plastics should be washed and squashed (bottles can be squashed and then lids replaced).

*Additional sacks* can be requested (a maximum of 3 per household) by calling the council on 01285 623123. If residents produce only a very small quantity of plastic they may place it in their black recycling box. If you don't want the sack leave it out and it will be re-used
