### The Last Produce Show & Fete?

It's show time again! Or at least the beginnings of it. The committee's latest meeting was able to use the valued survey input in the planning of this year's forthcoming produce show and fete set for Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> August. The survey results showed that the produce show remains a popular event and should largely stay in its current format yet it cannot continue without your active support.

For the ongoing future of the produce show and fete we would like your help with the following:

- 1. **We need a new chairman**. We have 4 meetings a year apart from the show and the most work is done during the weeks leading up to the show and on the day itself.
- 2. We need a new secretary. This involves minutes of meetings, contact/letters to judges etc, commitment on Show day making about a week's work in the entire year.
- 3. **We need a new field-marshall** in charge of marquees, siting of same etc. Most of the work involved is in the week leading up to the show; the show day itself and in the packing away after.
- 4. **We need your general help** with the event, without which it cannot happen. This includes setting up (erection of the marquee and tents etc) in the days before, running the stalls, helping with the auction and then clearing up afterwards.

It is never too early to let us know you are prepared to help.

### Sevenhampton Parish Council: Countdown to 2014

April 2013 is the start of the 4th & last year of the current Parish Council. There will be changes in that the Chairman and Parish Clerk intend to step down next year. Other Councillors have to decide whether they continue but new blood is going to be needed. The Parish council is a small local authority with a limited number of formal powers some of which apply here. In maintaining verges, bus shelters, public benches, supporting village halls, they can spend sums of money on things they consider in the interests of the parish and its inhabitants. It's also the focal point for discussion on planning applications and strategic planning and can represent Parish views to District and County Councils. To those ends, the council needs to reflect us all. Since the last council was formed in 2010, quite a few new residents have arrived. It is important that they, as well as long-term villagers, form part of the debate on the future shape of village life.

Like the Produce Show, the Parish Council depends on your involvement or we may lose it.

Perhaps in the coming months you could attend a Parish Council meeting, they're all open to all. The next is on May 15<sup>th</sup> in the Hall Reading Room at 7.30 pm.

### **VILLAGE HALL SURVEY FEEDBACK**

Thanks to the 80 who gave us a near 40% response rate, high for this kind of survey. The key points in the responses are

- A high level of awareness of the events and activities taking place in the hall.
- Suggestions about greater use of a Website and Facebook and making some of the advertising more eye catching are being followed up.
- A high level of satisfaction with accessibility.
- Satisfaction with the general level of upkeep and condition with some helpful comments for improvements which will be taken account of in the refurbishment planning.
- About 55% of respondents use the hall between once or twice a week and once or twice
  a month and there's a high level of satisfaction with the events and activities taking
  place in the hall. The Hall Management Committee interprets this as confirming that
  the hall continues to be a valued community asset.
- Support for a Lottery or 100 Club to provide funding for the hall. This is being followed up. ### **BROADBAND UPDATE**

Message from Tex Cook

The news is that the rollout is starting with 15000 homes and small businesses next month in the Forest and another 35000 from September.

At present we do not know when it will come to us but go to *fastershire.com* and sign up for information.

By the summer you should get maps from them showing how the roll out is proceeding plus all sorts of other information about how 'wonderful' it will be.

The plan is to run fibre to new cabinets within 50m of the existing green cabinets and also update the exchange. There will be some road works and disruption at some point.

The completion date remains December 2015 when we will all have a minimum of 2Mbps and most will have much more. This will make a huge difference for most people with speeds up to 80Mbps mentioned. Those not sorted by fibre will get another tailored solution like TV white space, wireless or satellite.
