The Village Archive

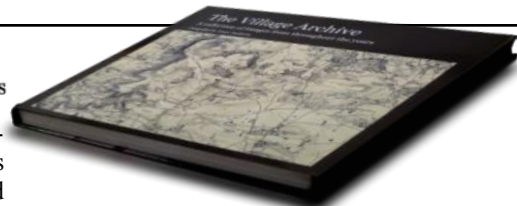
A collection of images from throughout the years

'No Crash' Road Safety Public Meeting

Some of you will be aware that residents and councillors set up a group last year to combat excessive speeds on our rural roads. We called ourselves 'No Crash' (North Cotswolds Rural area Against Speeding Harm) and I have been chairing our meetings. Our aim is to cut speeds along the A436 in particular and in surrounding villages. Over the last 12 months we've lobbied police and Glos Highways to take action and have succeeded in getting some improvements to road layouts, speed limits and police enforcement. However, this is a long term campaign and we'd like the authorities to do more.

We're holding a public meeting to discuss progress and get feedback from residents as to what they want to see happening with local road safety.

The meeting is on Wednesday 16 October, 7.30pm in the Andoversford Village Hall. Representatives from Highways and police will be there. Please come along if you can.
