Sevenhampton Good Neighbourhood Scheme

Background

In 1998 the Village Appraisal identified a need for transport for appointments, shopping or collecting prescriptions etc. It also confirmed that there were volunteers willing to help. Initial grants from the Gloucestershire Rural Community Council and the Women's Institute helped get the scheme going and set up all the initial organisation.



How it Works

A resident contacts one of the co-ordinators who will then arrange a driver from the list of 20 or so volunteers. There is a charge to cover the costs to the driver - see below*.

Funding

Since the original grant it has been run entirely on voluntary effort apart from the annual public liability insurance which, once partly funded by the WI, is now paid by the Parish Council. Occasional donations to the central fund cover the co-ordinators' costs.

Brockhampton Oil Club

"Would you like to buy your domestic heating oil cheaper and benefit the village environmentally?"

Benefits of the scheme are:-

- 1p discount to club members
- A commission paid annually to the club. Bids can then be made for the funding from societies and clubs in the community. This has generally been worth £250 of oil each year. Previous beneficiaries have been the Village Hall, Whittington Church and the Produce Show.
- Price will be the same irrespective of quantity ordered – same price per litre for 500 litres and 2,000 litres
- One set delivery day not to coincide with rubbish day, (Monday).
- A small tanker is used reducing the damage to verges, kerbs and hedgerows.
- A budget scheme and a top up scheme are available

Village Cinema

In Saudi Arabia they don't approve of the public showing of films so there are no cinemas. This means no film industry so 'Wadjda' (cert PG), showing on 13th February, is unique as the first feature length film made in that country. Not only that but it has been directed by a Saudi woman, Haifaa Al-Mansour. She overcame the social constraints by directing from the back of a van. She saw the action on TV monitors and used her mobile phone to instruct the cast and crew, with great success, to create the film she wanted.

The resulting film is about Wadjda, a lively ten year old girl in the suburbs of Riyadh, who desperately wants a bicycle so she can race her friend Abdullah - a local boy she shouldn't really be playing with. Her mother won't allow it as this society sees bicycles as dangerous to a girl's virtue. Wadjda decides to win the money to get the bike by entering a competition for reciting Koranic Verse at her oh-so-strict school.

The film highlights the issues facing women in modern Saudi society but with a light hand resulting in what BBC film critic, Mark Kermode, describes as "A really joyous and uplifting movie". It has achieved wide acclaim and won many awards. The film is in Arabic with subtitles.



Our March 13th film, **'Philomena'** (cert 12A), has also received many award nominations. It is based on a book by Martin Sixsmith, ex BBC journalist.

As a girl in Ireland Philomena Lee (Judi Dench) gave birth to an illegitimate son. The nuns who ran the catholic unmarried mothers' home pressured the girls to sign their babies up for adoption and never to enquire into their fates. Years later, with a grown family of her own in England, she meets Sixsmith (Steve Coogan), and decides to discover what became of her long-lost son.

This film has been nominated for Oscars, BAFTAs and Golden Globes including best film and best actress.
