Wanted - Parish Council and Parish Clerk

There will be an election for a new parish council in May of next year. Some of the current councillors may not be standing again and so new faces will be needed to form - and refresh - the council for the next four years.

The Parish Council is the lowest tier of local government and is granted powers by Parliament. A precept of £5,000 a year (2014/15) is levied which can be used for anything within the remit for parish councils which includes, with some restrictions, a broad power to use funds for anything to the general good of the inhabitants¹.

The Council also represents the views of the residents in consultations with the district and county councils.

The commitment is to six council meetings a year - one every two months. There can be up to seven councillors though currently only six places are taken and there is one vacancy. There is a worry that we could lose the parish council altogether if we cannot find enough people willing to serve. It is a useful forum for local discussion which is not replicated in the higher tiers of government.

Parish Clerk

Ann vanRossem, our Parish Clerk for many years will be retiring next year so we need someone to fill the post. The clerk is the council's "proper officer" appointed and employed by the council to discharge its functions. In our case the clerk is also the Finance Officer. The clerk is responsible for supporting the council in carrying out its functions. They have responsibility for ensuring these functions are carried out within local government law and in accordance with the councils policies etc. The job is paid according to a nationally agreed rate. Training is available.

In World War II Germany, young Liesel finds solace by stealing books and sharing them. In the basement of her home a Jewish refugee is being sheltered by her adoptive parents.




