#### Road Closed for Five Weeks through Brockhampton



The 'bridge' across the river Coln at Perch Pool\* is to be completely rebuilt. To enable this a traffic order will be in place *from 23*<sup>rd</sup> *February* 

until 3<sup>rd</sup> April which allows for complete closure of the road at that point. For how long the road will actually be closed remains to be seen. The official alternative route is via Syreford and the A436.

\*Perch Pool is at the very bottom of the hill in Brockhampton by Brockhampton Park grounds where the road crosses the River Coln.

For the first time in many years the telephone box in Brockhampton has a full complement of 'telephone' signs, a 'phone which is working and a light which comes on at night - 'The Brockhampton Illuminations'.

The winner of the limerick competition was Angela Barnard with this ditty.




