That Lowry Picture



A number of people have kindly contacted us to let us know the answers to the questions we posed in our last edition about the L. S. Lowry picture of 'Brockhampton 1930'. We asked which part of the village the sketch depicted and who Ted Frape was, the person to whom the picture was donated by the artist.

The sketch was one of a dozen or so he produced for a book by Harold Timperley - "A Cotswold Book" published in 1931. Timperley, a schoolmaster, was an author on English landscape. His wife also wrote on the same theme including several books

about the Cotswolds under the name Edith Brill. They lived in Ebrington and were amongst Lowry's closest friends at this time. The commission, one of the artist's earliest, came at the suggestion of Edith who was very fond of Lowry and felt it would be good to encourage her friend; "In those days he (Lowry) would get enormously depressed. On one such occasion, when he was particularly low, I persuaded Harold to ask Lowry to do the drawings for his Cotswold Book."

Ted Frape, born in 1910 was Christened Albert, but he hated the name and chose to be known as Ted. He was a graduate of the Manchester School of Art, and later Director of the Salford Art Gallery from 1946 until his untimely death in 1963. He was a great source of encouragement for Lowry supporting him and boosting his confidence by purchasing a lot of his works for Salford Art Gallery thereby creating the largest collection of Lowry paintings (over 400) in the world (although Frape was also critical of Lowry in his 'potato head' phase!).

Lowry was intensely grateful to Frape for his support and gave him a number of works, including the illustration of Brockhampton. Following Ted's death, his widow Lilian (they had no children) sold some of these, others were sold after her death in the 1990s. The Brockhampton illustration was sold last year for £42,500.

Another Brockhampton connection:

Ted & Lilian Frape were close friends of Alan and Mary Gee who moved to Brockhampton in 1964, the year after Ted died. They lived in 'Wychwood' until 1981, which many of you will know is the bungalow right at the top of Brockhampton, now home to Arthur & Di Brown. Alan & Ted had attended the same school. Although Ted had died in 1963 Alan & Mary's son Ian thinks that Ted's widow Lilian Frape must have visited 'Wychwood' after Ted's death.

Ian Gee and his wife retired to Charlton Kings from Manchester in 2001, having got to know the area well through frequent visits to Wychwood with their own family during the years his parents lived there. One of his best memories is of tobogganing down the field in front of the house. He's not alone there!

We are grateful to Ian for much of this information offered after he picked up a copy of this magazine on a visit to The Craven Arms.

As for the location, as many of you have pointed out it is the group of cottages at the top of the 'Quarry' in Brockhampton. A copy of the picture hangs in one of those cottages. The photograph on the right is a very rough approximation of the spot. Shrubbery, trees, new building and I think a certain amount of artistic licence rule out an exact match.
